- 5. Participant must be identified by name, grade, school attending and sponsoring Elks Lodge on the Essay.

AWARDS:

Plaques will be awarded by the Grand Lodge for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Place for national winning essays in Division I and Division II. Winners will be announced at the Grand Lodge Session in St. Louis, Missouri, June 30-July 3, 2019.

ENTRY DATE:

Essay should be submitted to local Elks Lodge on/before December 15, 2018. The Essay Contest Cover Sheet must be completed for each level of competition and remain attached to the Essay.

Dear Educators,

Chico Elks Lodge #423 invites you and your students to participate in the National Elks Americanism Essay Contest. This year's theme is "What Makes You Proud of America?"

These essays should be no more than 300 words long and will be judged on originality, topic development and language conventions and mechanics. If at all possible, please have your students format their essays to one side of the paper. Use your district's expository writing rubric as a guide if you wish. Good writing is good writing.

You have some options in how your students can participate. You might have the class or grade level team choose the best essays or let the students themselves vote. You might make participation voluntary or a homework assignment. You may turn in as many good essays as you wish.

Essays are due in our lodge any time between October 1st **and December 15, 2018.** Each essay must be accompanied by an official cover sheet and may be written by hand or by using Microsoft Word. Please see the page of essay contest rules for more information or go to chicoelks.com and click on "Events". Entry and submission information will be located there very soon.

In early January the essays will be judged by a group of Elks, including current and retired educators. The team will choose the top three essays in each of two divisions: Division 1 (combined 5th and 6th grades) and Division 2 (combined 7th and 8th grades). Local winners will receive cash awards and students and their families and their teachers will be invited to a dinner at the lodge to receive their awards and prizes. The first place essays in each division will move up to judging in a district level. Winning district level essays will then go on to both the state and national level. All area students who participate will receive a certificate from Chico Elks Lodge #423.

We know very well and appreciate the demands on your time and the decisions you make in planning and delivering instruction to your students. Many of us on this committee are working or retired educators ourselves. The essay meets Common Core Standards in both Text Types and Purposes and Production and Distribution of Writing.

5th Grade Text Types and Purposes

- 2. Write informative/explanatory texts to examine a topic and convey ideas and information clearly.
 - 1. Introduce a topic clearly, provide a general observation and focus, and group related information logically; include formatting (e.g., headings), illustrations, and multimedia when useful to aiding comprehension.
 - 2. Develop the topic with facts, definitions, concrete details, quotations, or other information and examples related to the topic.
 - 3. Link ideas within and across categories of information using words, phrases, and clauses (e.g., in contrast, especially).
 - 4. Use precise language and domain-specific vocabulary to inform about or explain the topic.
 - 5. Provide a concluding statement or section related to the information or explanation presented.
